**May 15, 2023** – Officer, Board Member and Committee Chair reports are due. Please limit reports to 300 words. There will not be a printed book of reports. All reports will be posted on the AVA website prior to the meeting under a special tab.

**May 24, 2023** – Regular Membership Meeting information packet which includes all reports and supplemental documents are emailed to Officers, Board Members, Committee Chairs, and Club Officers.

## REQUESTS FOR ADDITIONAL INSURED CERTIFICATES

Sometimes when a club hosts an event at a park, city, or private facility, the owners will ask to be added to AVA's insurance policy as an Additional Insured. This Additional Insurance Certificate covers outside parties who may have a financial stake in the club event. Clubs do not need to request Additional Insured Certificates for themselves because they are already covered under the AVA's General Liability Policy. ## HOW TO REQUEST AN ADDITIONAL INSURED CERTIFICATE

Go to the club's [my.ava.org](http://my.ava.org) home page and click on the Sanctions tab, then the Insurance tab.

Click on the Request Insurance button next to the event you wish to request Co-Insurance for.

Complete the form including the event POC information (who will be receiving the completed Certificate of Insurance (COI) via email) and enter the Additional Insured Info for COI case.

Hit the Submit button.

A request can be edited once submitted until it has been sent to the AVA Insurance provided (every Monday, Wed, and Friday around 4am)

Once a request has been sent to the Insurer. The club can create an additional COI request for an event if needed. Allow about a week for the COI pdf to be create and sent to the POC email address.

**Clubs must enter their event for sanctioning and get it approved by their Regional Director before using the Insurance tab to create a Certificate of Additional Insured request. (There is no support for getting Co-Insurance for unapproved events.)**

## INVITING ALL AVA CLUB MEMBERS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE KING WILLIAM PARADE!

In case you did not get enough of San Antonio during the Olympiad, we invite you to come back and participate in the King William Fair parade! This festival draws 35,000 visitors to the King William District and is one block away from the National Office. It is part of the city's annual Fiesta celebration which draws over 3 million people during the 10-day event in downtown San Antonio, Texas.

One of the successful outcomes of the Olympiad is that the AVA has been invited to participate in the annual King William Fair parade in San Antonio. AVA members who participate will be asked to carry one of the IVV or IML banners and walk a short route of 1.5 miles. Members are encouraged to bring old medals and pass them out to spectators along the route. Fiesta is all about the medals! **The parade is on Saturday, April 29, 9:00am – 11am. Parade formation starts at 8:00am.** After the parade, the AVA National Office will host snacks and refreshments for all AVA parade participants. Quite often I hear that many do not know about the AVA. This is an excellent opportunity to share with everyone who we are!

If the AVA were to host a roundtrip bus tour to the Crazy Horse Memorial Volkssmarch, leaving early morning on June 1st, from San Antonio, Texas and returning late evening on June 5th, from Rapid City, South Dakota, how many of our members might be interested in attending?

## WEST TEXAS TRAIL WALKERS -SUSAN NOONAN, PRESIDENT

**PALO DURO CANYON STATE PARK - CANYON, TEXAS - OCTOBER 6-8**

Hike Palo Duro Canyon, the second largest canyon in the United States, with the West Texas Trail Walkers on October 6-8, 2023. Palo Duro Canyon State Park, Canyon, Texas is known as "The Grand Canyon of Texas." The canyon is beautiful and has rugged, rusty red ridges layered with a palette of colors in reds, oranges, browns, greens and white. Explore the frontier history of this area -- the native Comanches hunting range and the huge Goodnight cattle ranch.

To start off the hiking weekend Friday, October 6, the West Texas Trail Walkers have selected two options. The moderate 7k starts with the Juniper trail on the canyon floor and gives you wide views of the canyon ridges. Towards the end of this option, the Rojo Grande/Sunflower trail follows a peaceful creek that is shaded with mature trees. The 10k option is also moderately difficult and starts in the lower canyon, climbs up to the Comanche trails and passes through the "Rock Garden." The Rock Garden is an awesome field of tumbled boulders.



The Saturday, October 7 hike features the well-known "Lighthouse" red rock pillar. The moderate 6k and 10k hikes traverse ravines and small hills with broad views of the surrounding cliffs. One 10k option is an out-and-back that goes to the Lighthouse. For more difficult hikes, take the 14k and 17k hikes which take you up to the Lighthouse ridge. The 17k adds more distance by hiking the Little Fox Canyon loop and returning to the start point on the Givens/Spicer/Lowery trail.

To finish the weekend on Sunday, October 8, hike the historic Civilian Conservation Corp trails near the entrance of the park. The 7k and 10k CCC/Goodnight trails were built during the 1930s and are difficult hikes with 600 feet elevation gain. At the top, you will be rewarded with stunning long-range views of the canyon. The 5k hike has less elevation but still gives you the experience of seeing long-range views of the canyon.

Walk the city of Canyon, Texas anytime over the long weekend. The 5 or 10k options are easy, flat walks on city sidewalks. The walk box will be available in the Best Western lobby October 5-9 or you can use the on-line start box from October 1 - December 31. Canyon is a thriving small city just outside Amarillo, Texas. The walk takes you through the pristine West Texas A & M University campus, Canyon main streets and past the Panhandle-Plains Historical Museum. The Museum is the largest history museum in Texas and the Texas Parks and Wildlife Division will have a special display there in October celebrating the 100 year anniversary of the Texas State Park system.

Be sure to check out the camping and lodging options in Palo Duro Canyon State Park. The park offers historic CCC cabins, glamping sites, full RV hookups and tent camping through the on-line reservation systems, [texasstateparks.reserveamerica.com](https://texasstateparks.reserveamerica.com). You can also purchase Park day passes for \$8.00 per person on this on-line system as early as one month before the hiking weekend. Hotel lodging at Best Western, Holiday Inn or Hampton Inn is also available in Canyon, Texas.

Pre-registration opens in early June when the brochure and registration forms are available on [www.westtexastrailwalkers.org](http://www.westtexastrailwalkers.org). Safety Precautions: Because Palo Duro is a remote canyon, hikers should not plan on having cell phone reception. Anyone hiking in remote areas of the park is encouraged to carry plenty of water and a snack. Be sure to wear sunscreen, a hat and hiking boots. For balance bring hiking sticks.
